Reflection on Sunday's readings:

First reading: "Before the bliss of heaven, we should expect to be tried and tested. Before this, though, you will be persecuted and seized and handed over to the synagogues and to prisons and they will lead you before kings and governors because of my name."

<u>Second Reading</u>: As we approach the end of the liturgical year, our readings offer a sober reminder that this life is not our aim and that God's justice will triumph in the end. Now is the time to get our priorities in order, putting God above all else as his faithful stewards. St. Paul's letter to the Thessalonians, reinforces the message that we must conduct ourselves as good stewards involves not only action in certain areas, it means refraining from certain actions and areas that are none of our concern. Onward Christian stewards, the struggle is worth the joy that awaits.




