

Reflection on Sunday's readings:

First reading: Swayed by the Serpent, Adam and Eve became ungrateful and distrustful despite God's great love for them and all the gifts of creation He had provided. These are the temptations that threaten to pull us away from God today. This is why we need the 40 days and nights, so much. Let us embrace the 40-day spiritual reset, and examine our lives and make changes where needed so that we can become stronger in overcoming temptations to sin.

Second Reading: The second reading, from St. Paul's letter to the Romans, sums up this ancient story and reminds us that the same all-perfect God who created Adam and Eve and that good Garden has provided a remedy for our sins—the saving love and perfect obedience of Jesus on our behalf. "For just as through the disobedience of the one man, the many were made sinners, so through the obedience of the one, the many will be made righteous." This is truly Good News!
