

Reflection on Sunday's readings:

First reading: Peter is found embracing his role as leader of the newborn Church. Our first reading from Acts, he exhorts the crowd," Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." The ones who accepted his message were baptized that day. Peter simply proposed the Good News to them and then left them free to accept or reject the call to repentance and belief in Christ, which is ultimately a call from God. Jesus describes Himself as the "Good Shepherd." 'The sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. He walks ahead of them and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice."

Second Reading: The second reading offers motivation for embracing this way of life. Christ "bore our sins in is body upon the cross and by his wounds you have been healed. We had gone astray like sheep but, have now returned to the shepherd and guardian of our souls." This is a poignant description of the love our Savior has for us and the kind of relationship He desires to have with us. This Easter season, let us resolve to freely give all of ourselves and our lives gratefully to Him.
