Reflection on Sunday’s readings:

First reading: There was an unnamed man- Jesus said to go to his house and celebrate Passover with His disciples. We know that the man agreed to the request-he shared the material gift of his home and the gift of hospitality. Because of his stewardship, his home became the site of the institution of the Eucharist!

Simon the Cyrenian, offered his physical strength, helping the Lord to carry his cross.

Joseph of Arimathea- offered his tomb and a proper burial.

The two Marys- gave Jesus their gift of Time-keeping watch after His death.

Second Reading: Each of these were simple acts of good stewardship. God used them in mighty ways. There is no greater motivation to embrace this stewardship way of life than to turn our attention to the details of the Passion of our Lord and what He undertook for love of us. Consider and spend time this week on your own or with family, pondering what Jesus has done for each one of us personally.

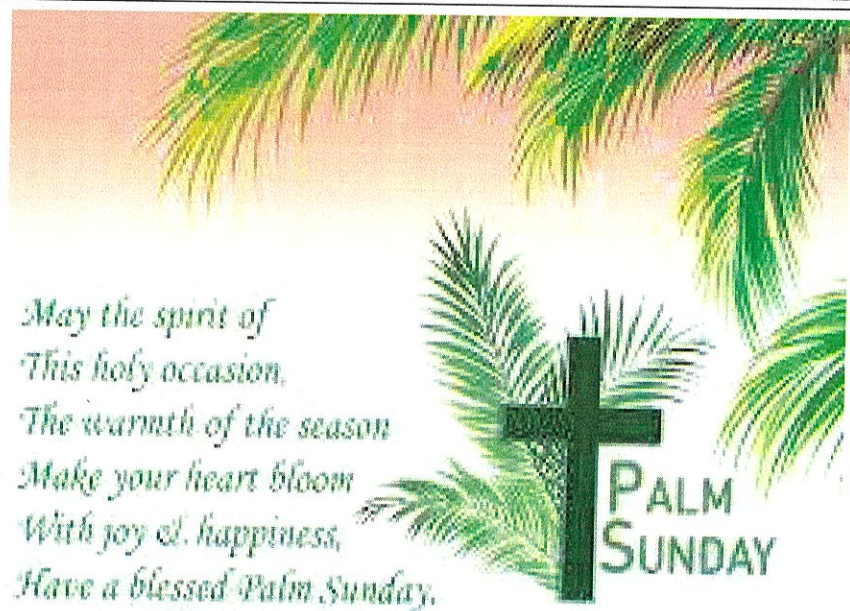

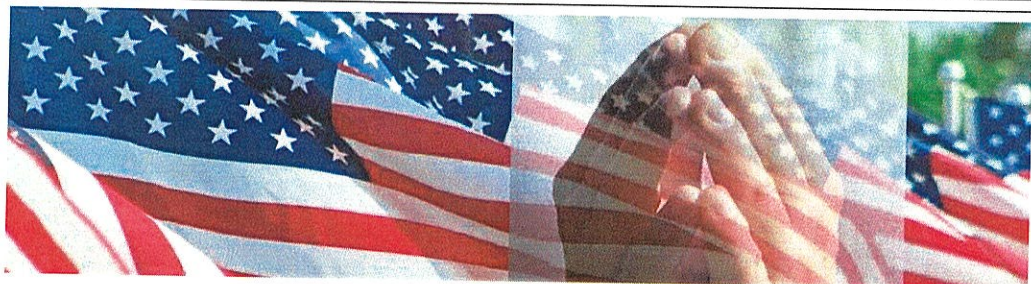
