Reflection on Sunday's readings:

First reading: Stewardship starts at home. We read about how the members of the early church complained "because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution." Stewardship is not just about going to Mass once a week, serving in ministries and giving financially to the parish. Those are all essential parts of stewardship. Stewardship begins with our families, our domestic churches. The domestic church plays a key role in our sanctification -it is the place where we practice intimate and selfless love of other persons. In other words stewardship is not something that we do-it is who we are.

<u>Second Reading</u>: The second reading St. Peter instructs, "Let yourselves be built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." Peter is speaking to each one of us who are disciples of Christ by virtue of our Baptism. The <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church</u> tells us "it is here that all members of the famly exercise the priesthood of the baptized in a privileged way 'by the reception of the sacraments, prayer and thanksgiving, the witness of a holy life, self denial and active charity. Thus, home is the first school of Christian life.
