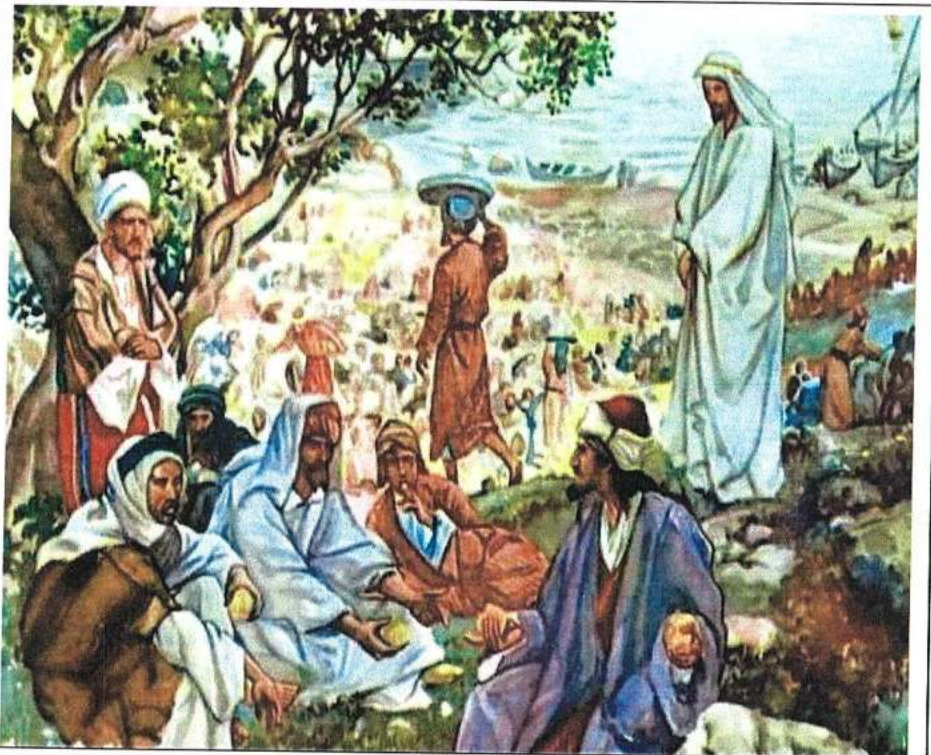

Reflection on Sunday's readings:

First reading: As stewards, we know that all things, including time, are gifts from the Lord. The time to know, love, and serve God is now! We can not waste precious moments that He has given us. We must prioritize our time even though it may not meet the world's priorities. We can not focus on worldly things like "getting ahead", "looking out for number one" and the idea that "time is money. As His followers, we must strive as best we can to think as God does, using our time with eternity in mind.

Second Reading: St. Paul describes this radical kind of thinking. He says, "Christ will be magnified in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me life is Christ, and death is gain. " For Paul, life is not about Paul. It's about Christ. We must not compare ourselves to others and sense that not everyone is contributing as much as we are to the parish, the neighborhood, within our family and so on. We need to think bigger! We must remember that it is a great privilege to have been called by the Father to work in His vineyard. The more time we are give to do his work, the greater the gift!

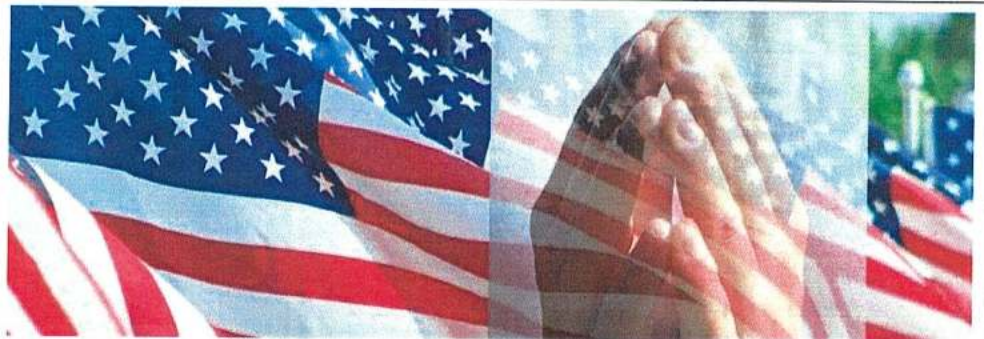
