



Reflection on Sunday's readings:

<u>First reading:</u> In the first reading, God, through Malachi, addresses those who do not sincerely practice their faith. Malachi says:"You have turned aside from the way."The "Way" with a capital "W" was what early Christians were called. It stems from Jesus' statement, "I am the way, the truth, and the life." Malachi points out that turning aside from the way is an unacceptable and insincere act. Acting in this way is the opposite of humility.

Second Reading: St. Paul understood what it meant to be humble. His focus was always on the faith and on Christ, not any personal glorification. St. Paul says, "We were determined to share with you not only the gospel of God but our very selves as well." Paul makes it clear-he was among the Thessalonians to give something not to take something from them. Paul says,"And for this reason, we give thanks to God unceasingly, that, in receiving the word of God from hearing us, you received not a human word, but the word of God." Paul could see how effective it is with those who hear it and believe it. Paul knew that there was power in the Word of God to change lives. Jesus was truly the greatest among them, but He always spoke of Himself and viewed Himself as a servant. This is the true meaning of "humility".





