Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our diocese will participate in the national collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) on November 18/19. Your support for this collection brings much-needed help and change to our brothers and sisters across the country. Nationally, CCDH-funded groups tackle a wide range of economic and social justice challenges, including housing, education, mitigating the impacts of climate change, and advocating for healthy foods in urban food deserts. In addition to making a national impact, the CCHD collections allow us to help those living in poverty or suffering from the symptoms of poverty right here in our own community.

Some of the ministries in our diocese have benefited from funds from the CCHD collections:

- Diocesan "Culture of Life Conference."
- **Justice United Seeking Transformation**, an interfaith non-profit based in Escambia County, addressing the high rates of youth arrests and lack of affordable housing.
- **Capital Area Justice Ministry** is an interfaith non-profit based out of Leon County seeking to address gun violence and the lack of affordable housing in the Tallahassee Area.

In addition, our Director of Advocacy and Justice has been working with local organizations and parishioners to promote the Good News in other ways:

- **Floridians for Alternative to the Death Penalty** seeks to end the use of the death penalty in Florida.
- **Sponsorship of parishioners to attend the Eucharistic Revival** in Indianapolis in summer 2024.

All of these organizations are in line with Catholic Social Teaching, and there is a strong Catholic presence in the leadership of these organizations/ministries.

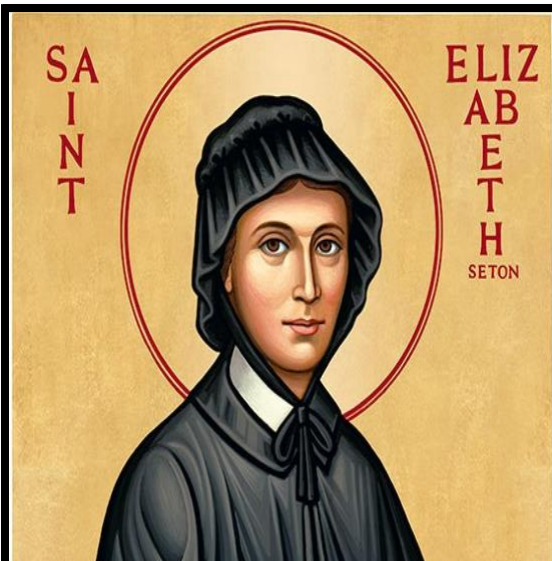

Reflection on Sunday's readings:

First reading: Our first reading, is from the Book of Wisdom. We must ask ourselves- How does the seeking of wisdom-not worldly wisdom, but the wisdom that comes from the Holy Spirit-“free from care”? It causes us to rely on God to lead and guide us. This is a freeing way to approach life, removing pressure from us to have all the answers- because the truth is, we don't. The world is too complicated and unpredictable. The Christian steward can rest in the power of the Holy Spirit to help us navigate in any situation.

Second Reading: In our second reading, St. Paul teaches us to be wise in our attitude toward death---our own and our loved ones. If we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God, through Jesus, bring with him those who have passed on. This reminds us that death does not have the final word, because Jesus has conquered death. We are wise stewards if we live our lives with this truth in mind, setting priorities that will keep us ready to face our judgment day. The stewardship way of life-with all its commitments to giving God the best of our Time, Talent and Treasure—is what we should keep with us at all times. We must rely deeply on the Holy Spirit to guide us through the twists and turns of each day, so that we may be free and ready to answer when he calls us. We live in wisdom.

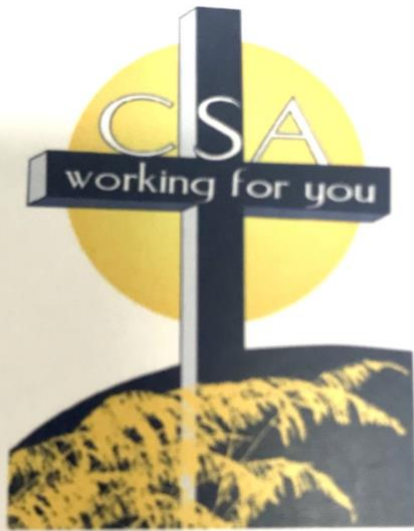
