Reflection on Sunday's readings:

First reading: Our First Reading from Isaiah tells us of all the comfort and tender love that God has for each one of us. Out of this love that God has for us, as Christian Stewards we are to “prepare the way of the Lord. Make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God!”. Prepare to account one day for the ways of our lives. We must prepare to celebrate the coming of the Lord.

Second Reading: St. Peter wants us to realize the loving kindness of the Father. He says we must conduct ourselves in “holiness and devotion” and we shall be at peace with one another. This is what Advent is about-a “reset” to return to living lives focused on Christ, in gratitude for all He has done for us. We will honor both the mercy and justice of our God, and we will be prepared to celebrate the birth of Christ and give account for all His gifts to us. Most importantly, remember that the most precious gift He has given us is His own Son, Whose birth we are preparing to celebrate.

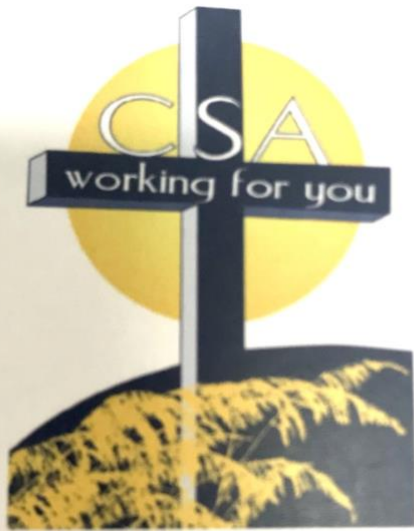
