“Come Down O Love Divine (pt 3)

Go Forth with the strength you have...Tgs 6:14 My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness...2 Cor 12:9

Who can know the mind of God....I surely don't but I can truthfully say God was never idle in my life. While at Fr. Rucker before the fires of tribulations stormed us, I encountered the grace of God in a profound moment one evening when I learned of the apparitions of Our Lady of Medjugorje. Our Lady came with such grace beyond all telling. I 've always loved our Lady. Living her messages drew me into a deep relationship with Jesus I had never know before. He was that light in all the pain and suffering we experienced during that time. Then came the Holy Spirit as an anointing balm that brought peace and healing to our home in Sopchoppy. All seemed right and well in the world as the boys began school, Dave found work and I did, too, till I returned to college and obtained a degree in Psychology and completed studies in Catholic Theology to provide pastoral counseling. I worked 10 years in two different crisis pregnancy centers in Tallahassee encountering life and death battles for little souls and for their mothers and fathers, too. God moved again and he brought me to Disc Village in their Sisters in Sobriety residential program providing drug and alcohol rehab counseling. I had only been with them 4 months when David called me one morning and said he had test results that came back positive. It was cancer. The next two years were filled with numerous doctor visits, treatments and constant testing. I stormed heaven with prayers and pleas for healing. I couldn't imagine life without David at my side. He was my joy...my everything! I stood my ground....bolstered my courage and faced the gale force winds head on knowing full well God was at my side and he would reef the sails as need be. Hospice assisted us with home care for him. In the early hours of May 5th, 2010 David was surrounded by our three sons and myself as he drew his last breath here on earth and his first breath as he entered heaven greeted by Our Lady and Our Lord and all our loved ones gone before us.

In that very moment everything I knew stopped. The dark night of the soul descended and it was darker than I had ever experienced before. My only refuge was daily Mass, the Eucharist and adoration on Friday evenings. As time moved forward there was one Friday night as I drove home I began getting that dreaded feeling all over me of coming home to no one when I heard Him speak in my heart and He said, "*You never dreaded coming home to David, why do you dread coming home to Me?*" Oh, how I cried! Jesus never rushed me through my mourning David...it was a deep wound that needed deep healing. His peace began to surround me and I came home to Jesus waiting for me in my prayer corner. From then on Friday evenings became "*court'n night*" with Jesus. We don't date...we court each other in our hearts and souls in adoration. It is a love beyond all telling.
