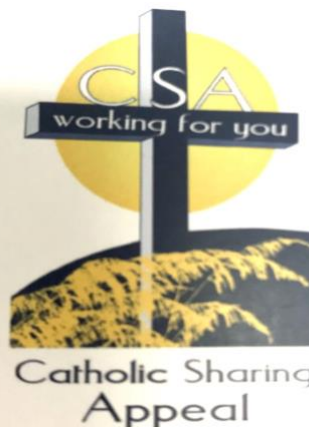

WELCOME: “ I’M JUST AN USHER’

Mike never even vaguely considered himself a minister at his church “come on”, he would say: “The people who give out the Eucharist, the ones who lector, maybe they are ministers, but me “ I’m just an usher”.

The priest in the parish had given a talk on the “ministry” of greeter and usher but Mike wasn’t buying the “malarkey”. He said he was just trying to “give the Pastor a hand” by taking up the collection, steering people to Holy Communion and saying “Hi” to parishioners when they come into the church.

Mike believed that, until one night he came home from work and his wife told him the pastor called. Mike returned the call and the pastor told him a letter had been received at the rectory. The letter was simply addressed to “Mike the usher”.

The priest said that since he was the only usher called Mike, would he please pick up his letter. Mike, intrigued by the request, complied and on the way home ripped open the envelope and in the light of the car read. Dear Mike, I don’t know your last name, but I guess that’s fair you don’t know mine either. I’m Mary, Mary from the 7:30 am Mass. I am writing you for a couple of reasons and hope you will understand.

One of the reasons is to ask a favor. I am not particularly close to anyone in the parish but somehow I feel close to you. I don’t even know how you got to know my first name, but every Sunday morning when I walked into Mass, you smiled and greeted me and called me by my name. We would exchange a few words that perhaps were meaningless to most, like the weather, or my Easter hat or whatever. I don’t have any close family left, Mike. My husband has been dead for 16 years and the kids are scattered. Not too any people smile and greet an old lady like me, but you did.

Mike, in the little time left to me, I wanted to say Thank You for your smiles and the little laughter, the consideration and the conversation.

Now, for the favor – I am dying, Mike. My time is running out. It is not important that you come to my wake, but what is important is that when they bring me to the Church for Mass for the last time, you will be standing at the entrance. It wouldn’t seem right if you weren’t standing there to say “Hello Mary, good to see you”. If you are there Mike, I will feel assured that your warm Hospitality in my home parish will be duplicated by Peter, Jesus and Mary in my new parish, my new home. I hope they will say as you always did, “Hello, Mary, it is good to see you”.

Gus and I moved into this area 3 years ago because our children wanted us to be nearby. We are in our eighties and would be nearby in case of any emergencies that may arise. We had nothing to hold us down in Broward County except our friends from our Parish, Our Lady Queen of Heaven.

We visited churches in this area to find a one we would like to attend. We decided to make St. Elizabeth Ann Seton our new home. One of the reasons we chose SEAS was the friendliness of the ushers who greeted us with big smiles and welcoming us when we entered the church. We have made some wonderful friends since we arrived. It definitely was a good decision!

Ushers are important to our church. I saved this article that I had read many years ago in the bulletin and wanted to share it with you.
