Amen

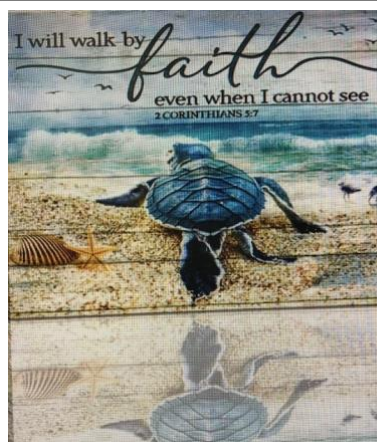

I was raised in the United Methodist Church. I attended faithfully growing up. I attended Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, Choir and Church services often. I enjoyed hanging out with friends I made at Church. I went on field trips and choir trips often. After my mom passed away when I was fourteen, my dad wanted to stop going to Church. He had a hard time dealing with my mom's death and blamed God. I kept attending Church but had to find a way there or drive myself when I got a car after turning sixteen.

After I left for college, I did not find a Church to attend. I would go home on many weekends, but the ways of the world had a pull on me, and other things became more important. I would go every so often, but not like I used to. It wasn't until after I was married and had my daughter, Anna, that I wanted to get back into going to Church. My husband was raised Church of Christ, so the United Methodist Church was different from what he was used to, and he used to joke it was like the Catholic Church. Things that I was drawn to in the Methodist Church was reciting the Apostle's Creed, the responses back to the Reverend, participating in Communion, and being surrounded by loving Christians. It was preparing my way to eventually join the Catholic Church.

After years of attending the United Methodist Church, off and on, things started to change in the Church. They were ignoring tradition and becoming increasingly more liberal. I didn't agree with many things they were doing so I left. It was many years before I even considered attending other Churches. In the meantime, I questioned my faith and many things I had previously believed. I was bombarded with messages in the media condemning Christian beliefs. I started to question many things I had believed and unfortunately was an agnostic for a while. I wanted to believe but had many doubts and was surrounded by many people with no faith.

We bought a vacation home here about four years ago. With Covid, I was able to work from home all week, so my husband, son and I stayed most of the time here, with our main home outside of Nashville. I was so busy working on projects around the house, I didn't think to find a Church home here. Last year, my son, Jordan, wanted to find a Church to attend. We went to many different Churches to see which one felt right. None did until we started attending the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Catholic Church. I felt out of place at first and had no idea how to participate in the Mass, but with help from parishioners, felt more comfortable as the weeks went by. We were both drawn to the Tradition Latin Mass, which we had seen many You Tube videos about. When we are in Tennessee, we attend St. Martha's Catholic Church, which has a Traditional Latin Mass. When I am in Nashville for work, I also attend St. Mary of the Seven Sorrow's Catholic Church downtown, which is so beautiful and historic. All Catholic Churches I attend have different services and I have learned how to participate in all of them. There are many things at each Catholic Church that I enjoy. I have learned how to say prayers in Latin by attending the Traditional Latin Mass. I enjoy the homilies at every Catholic Church I attend. I like that the Mass is structured the way it is so everyone knows what to expect and can follow along and these traditions go all the way back to Jesus.

I am so grateful that my son, Jordan, did the research to find out that the Catholic Church is the one true Church, because I was not taught that growing up. I am blessed to be among the many faithful parishioners of the world that can say, "Yes, I believe in Jesus and am proud to be Catholic."
