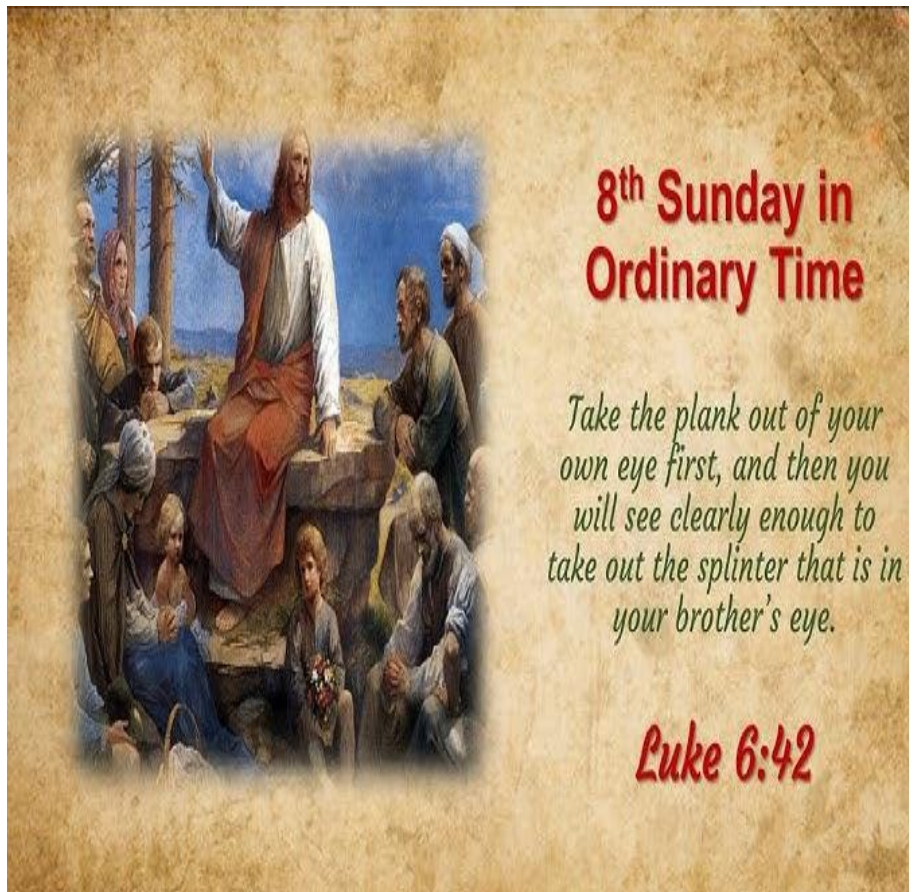

Jubilee Year of Hope -From Bishop Wack

Pilgrimage Diocesan Site-Tallahassee Co-Cathedral of St. Thomas More

The Holy Father encourages all the faithful to set out as “pilgrims of hope” throughout the great Jubilee of 2025. While the principal destination for pilgrimage this year will be the Eternal City of Rome, Pope Francis has provided many opportunities to obtain a plenary indulgence for those unable to make the journey to Italy. Some examples are: Be Moved by a spirit of charity, Be purified through the Sacrament of Penance, Be refreshed by Holy Communion, Pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff.

Method 1: Visit Diocesan Pilgrimage Sites – Bishop Wack has designated the Co-Cathedral of St. Thomas More, where the faithful can participate in the Jubilee year of hope are a follows: In addition to the aforementioned **necessary spiritual disposition**, the faithful should, for a suitable period of time, Engage in eucharistic adoration and meditation; it is not necessary for Eucharist to be exposed in the monstrance, Conclude the time of adoration and meditation by praying our Father, Recite a Profession of Faith such as the [Nicene Creed](#), [Apostles' Creed](#) or the official [Profession of Faith](#), and pray an invocation to the Mother of God such as the Hail Mary, [Hail Holy Queen](#), [Memorare](#), [Regina Caeli](#), [Angelus](#), or the [Magnificat](#).

Method 2 : For The Homebound and Those Unable to Travel- Instructions for the Faithful who are homebound or unable to travel, but would still like to receive the Jubilee indulgence: Pray our Father, Recite a Profession of Faith, such as the Nicene Creed, Apostles' Creed or the official Profession of Faith, Offer prayers in conformity with the objectives of the Holy Year, such as people experiencing God's mercy through genuine penance, encountering the profound love of God, individuals being moved to express acts of hope in the corporal and spiritual works of mercy, etc., Spiritually offer up their sufferings or the hardships of their lives.

Method 3: Through the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy-From the decree by the Apostolic Penitentiary: *In a special way “during the Holy Year, we are called to be tangible signs of hope for those of our brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind” (Spes non confundit, 10). Therefore, the Indulgence is also linked to certain works of mercy and penance, which bear witness to the conversion undertaken. The faithful, following the example and mandate of Christ, are encouraged to carry out works of charity or mercy more frequently, especially in the service of those brothers and sisters who are burdened by various needs. More especially, they should rediscover these “corporal works of mercy: to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, welcome the stranger, heal the sick, visit the imprisoned, and bury the dead” (Misericordiae vultus, 15) and rediscover also “the spiritual works of mercy: to counsel the doubtful, instruct the ignorant, admonish sinners comfort the afflicted, forgive offences, bear patiently those who do us ill, and pray for the living and the dead”(ibid.). In this way, the faithful will be able to obtain the Jubilee Indulgence if they visit, for an appropriate amount of time, their brothers and sisters who are in need or in difficult (the sick, prisoners, lonely elderly people, disabled people..), in a sense making a pilgrimage to Christ present in them. (cf. Mt.25,34-36) according to the usual spiritual, sacramental and prayer conditions. The faithful can repeat these visits throughout the Holy Year, even daily, acquiring a plenary indulgence each time. The Jubilee plenary Indulgence can also be obtained through initiatives that put into practice, in a concrete and generous way, the spirit of penance which is, in a sense, the soul of the Jubilee. In particular the penitential nature of Friday can be rediscovered through abstaining, in a spirit of penance, at least for one day of the week, as well as by donating a proportionate sum of money to the poor, support the defense and protection of life, and supporting the quality of life of abandoned children, young people in difficulty, the needy or lonely elderly people, or migrants from various countries. (Spes non confundit, 13)*
